Tuesday

The Minister for Business and Budget will answer questions on behalf of the First Minister. She will be asked to comment on improving cancer services in South Wales Central and access to GPs.

AMs will vote on a motion to approve the principles of the Carers Strategy (Wales) Measure.

Wednesday

In a Conservative proposed debate, AMs will debate the UK's budget deficit.

Thursday
